After my lesson, the denominational preacher and those preachers invited by him asked me many questions. I got the good time to discuss with them and explain to them according to word of God. They were very happy to study further and also invited me in next month.

> Recently the Baker congregation, the Esto congregation, and some individuals sent some monetary support to brother Kumar. He stays busy, and is seeing fruit from his labors, and I believe that sending that support was a great decision.

> I met brother Kumar online in 2012 after I had returned from a mission trip with some other brothers to China and Singapore. While in China, I bought the Christians a webcam, and when I returned home, I began teaching them Bible classes online. During this time brother Kumar contacted me for the first time, asking me for support for his work in India. I asked him to fill out a detailed doctrinal questionnaire, and after he successfully filled it out, the congregation with whom I was working in Nesbit, Mississippi arranged for some Bibles to be delivered to him for his work. Brother Kumar then asked me to come to India. I told him I

could not come to India at that time, but that he could gather some people together and join us for an online class on Fridays. He did this, and actually found people from various parts of the world to join in also. Since then, the Chinese Christians decided it would be best not to continue the class, for fear of government persecution. I told them that I understood, and that maybe they could join again in the future, but brother Kumar and others who speak the Telugu language of India continue to join the class every Friday from various parts of the world. I thank God and glorify God for the opportunities, and I appreciate Christians like brother Kumar who are so dedicated.

The words, "could" and "don't," are very telling. COULD shows that one has the ability to do something. DON'T means that the individual is not willing to do what he is capable of doing.

We often ask: "Why don't you?" NOTE: The Lord is not concerned about the why. Most of the time is it just a piddly excuse. Regardless of the why, they still don't.

Don't indicates inaction. Two verses come to mind. "But be ye doers of the word, and not hearers only, deceiving your ownselves" (James 1:22). "Blessed is that servant, whom his lord when he cometh shall find so doing" (Luke 12:43).

We need to change: "I could, but I don't" to "I could, and I will."
