

Facts about Acts

- A. Written by Luke
 - 1. See notes on the gospel of Luke A
 - 2. Acts is a continuation of Luke the two overlap (Lk. 24:49-52; Acts 1:4-12)
- B. Written probably between 61-64 A. D.
- C. Contains 1007 verses divided into 28 chapters
- D. Purpose of Acts
 - 1. Tells the history of the early church its growth, its persecution, and how it dealt with various problems
 - 2. Tells the work of some of the apostles
 - 3. Tells the work of the Holy Spirit
 - 4. Serves as a bridge between the gospels and the epistles. Without Acts there would be a huge gap between the two. We would not know many important things about the church.
 - 5. Shows us how people lived Christianity

 - Peter and John (3 4)
 - All the apostles (5)
 - Stephen (6 7)

Bullies at School

Last night one of our young people came forward asking for prayers for the bullies at school. He was following a Biblical principle that tells us to pray for our enemies (Matt. 5:44).

Isn't it sad that young people go to school and have to fear being mistreated by another student? This should not be. Sadly, it manifests a problem in our society and problems within our homes.

Prey on the innocent. Mistreat the weak. Take advantage of the tenderhearted. Harm those who are kind. Make fun of the feeble. Rob and plunder the peaceful. Put down those who are loving. Aggravate those who mind their own business. Instill fear into a child who should feel secure.

What would make one child, or a group of children, do the things we just listed?

My friends, we have far too many homes, too many parents, and too many children who are without God. "God is love" (I John 4:8). Love conducts itself in extremely noble ways (I Cor. 13:4-8a). Sadly, this love is not taught in homes.

Children see anger, hate, evil speaking, abuse, neglect. They see their parents mocking religion. They see their parents refusing to submit to the will of God. Human life means nothing. Selfishness is the bottom line of life. Consciences have been seared with a hot iron. Hearts have been hardened like rock. Might makes right.

Christians have a very important work to do. We MUST take the gospel to the world. We must help others to crucify and bury the old man of sin. We must replace that dead man of sin with Jesus Christ. This happened to a blasphemous murderer named Saul. He wrote: "I am crucified with Christ: nevertheless I live; yet not I, but Christ liveth in me: and the life which I now live in the flesh I live by the faith of the Son of God, who loved me, and gave himself for me" (Gal. 2:20). When this happens to a bully, he will become a friend of the weak and protector of the innocent.
