



A Few (?) Words from Jason

The study Glenn and I had with two "Jehovah's Witnesses" last week ended prematurely. When we wanted them to explain why they believe the kingdom came with power in 1914, they brushed off the question and started talking about something else. Then I asked again why they believe the kingdom came in 1914, and they said they needed to go, but they would leave a book for us to read. This is one of their most foundational teachings, so it is surprising that they don't seem comfortable discussing it. On the other hand, I think I know why. There is no real Biblical support for it, and for over 100 years they have been misapplying verses like Matthew 24:34: "Verily I say unto you, This generation shall not pass, till all these things be fulfilled." Although Jesus was speaking of the generation of His day witnessing the destruction of Jerusalem (24:16; Luke 21:20), the "Jehovah's Witnesses" have taught that the generation Jesus had in mind was the generation of 1914! According to them, the generation of World War I was not supposed to pass until Christ removed all the wicked from earth and established an earthly paradise with no more sickness, disease, or death. As we get farther and farther from that time period, they have to come up with new ways to explain away blatant errors such as these, and it becomes more and more obvious that they are a false religion!

I wonder if many of our religious friends who are not Jehovah's Witnesses realize that they also have been deceived by the same types of errors. It is not uncommon to hear people from practically any denomination talking about how things like "wars and rumors of wars" are indicating that we are now in the "end times" (cf. Matthew 24:6). They fail to understand that Jesus was foretelling the destruction of Jerusalem in the first part of Matthew 24. He was answering the first question He was asked, which was regarding the destruction of Jerusalem (24:1-34); however, He gave no signs for His literal return at the end of the world (24:35—25:46). Jesus knew

when Jerusalem would be destroyed, but even He did not know when He would literally return at the end of the world! (24:36; Mark 13:32; 1 Thessalonians 5:1-2).

The study with the denominational preachers went very well. I taught for about two hours and allowed them to ask me any questions. I mainly talked about the one church we find in the Bible and water baptism. We will see what happens next. We may do a series of lessons. They seem to be interested. They asked questions about the thief on the cross, Acts 19:1-5, and Romans 10:13. When they asked about Acts 19, this gave me the chance to back up to the end of chapter 18 to use the example of the goodhearted, talented preacher named Apollos, who changed after he learned the Truth about baptism. I said there may be some present to whom that would apply today. I am including here some of the images I used when teaching them. We give glory and thanks to God.

We "call on the name of the Lord" (appeal to His authority) to be saved when we are baptized to be saved (Acts 2:21>2:38; 22:16; cf. 1 Peter 3:20-21). Is the blood of Christ for the forgiveness of sins, or is water baptism for the forgiveness of sins? Both are (see the table to the right). The Bible assigns the same purposes to water baptism as it does to Christ's blood! This can only mean one thing: We contact His saving blood when we are baptized into His death (Romans 6:3-5). In His death, there was both blood and water (read John 19:33, 34).
