



Friend, I Want You to Know This **About Jesus' Church**

Drive down the road, and you won't travel far until you come to a church building with a name on it representative of a creed and people. Go a little further and you will find another church building, with another name on it representative of a different creed and people. How confusing it must be to those who are diligently searching for the truth of which church is right.

When one searches for the true church we read about in the New Testament, what will he find? This short essay will point out some of the characteristics of the one true church.

Friend, I want you to know that Jesus' church was built upon the right foundation.

Jesus said, "...Upon this rock [this solid foundation] I will build my church..." (Mt. 16:18). The solid foundation is the Christ, the Son of God. Peter is not the foundation upon which the church is built. The church that belongs to Christ was not built upon Martin Luther, John Wesley, John Calvin, or any other man. Jesus is the foundation upon which the church is built. He is the stone that is made the head of the corner. Paul wrote, "For other foundation can no man lay than that is laid, which is Jesus Christ" (1 Cor. 3:11).

Friend, I want you to know that Jesus' church is not a denomination.

The world denomination is simply defined as division. The world is full of religious division or denominations. Yet, the Lord said, "Neither pray I for these alone, but for them also which shall believe on me through their word; That they all may be one; as thou, Father, art in me, and I in thee, that they also may be one in us: that the world may believe that thou hast sent me" (Jn. 17:20-21). Denominationalism is directly opposed to the unity which Jesus prayed for.

On a differing occasion, Paul told the divided Christians in Corinth, "Now I beseech you, brethren, by the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that ye all speak the same thing, and that there be no divisions among you; but that ye be perfectly joined together in the same mind and in the same judgment" (1 Cor. 1:10). Denominationalism is also in direct violation of that which the inspired penman wrote.

Friend, I want you to know that Jesus' church wears a Bible name.

Why would I want to be a member of a church that wears the name of a man rather than the Lord (ie. Baptist, Wesleyan, Lutheran, etc.)? I only want to be a member of a church that wears a Bible name. For instance, in Paul's letter to the Romans he penned these words, "Salute one another with an holy kiss. **The churches of Christ** salute you" (Rm. 16:16, NR).

Friend, I want you to know that Jesus' church was paid for with the blood of Christ.

The church that belongs to Christ was paid for with His life's blood. "Take heed therefore unto yourselves, and to all the flock, over the which the Holy Ghost hath made you overseers, to feed the church of God, which he hath purchased with his own blood" (Acts 20:28). The Lord did not shed His blood to establish one single denomination. He shed His blood to establish the church. As one put it, "the devil holds the mortgage on every denomination, and one day he is going to foreclose."

Friend, I want you to know that Jesus' church practices scriptural worship.

Today, you name it and it can be considered worship. I know brethren who have become delinquent in attendance finding more pleasure on a lake or at the golf course on Sunday than at the church building for worship. When asked about their dereliction of duty they respond, "Well I am worshipping God in nature."

For it to be true New Testament worship, two things are required--spirit and truth. The Lord said, "God is a Spirit: and they that worship him must worship him in spirit and in truth" (Jn. 4:24). The right spirit is the right attitude. The truth is that

for which we have New Testament authority. That is why--in biblical churches of Christ--you will find singing versus singing and playing an instrument (Eph. 5:19), the Lord's supper being served every Sunday (Acts 20:7), praying (1 Thes. 5:17), giving (1 Cor. 16:1-2) and preaching (Acts 2:42).

I want to be a member of the church of Christ for these reasons. You see, one day I will stand before the Christ in Judgment to give an account of my life-including my religious practices. If I am not a member of His church, what then? Will you obey the gospel of Christ, thus being added to Jesus' church? (Acts 2:38,47).

Interesting Quotes Regarding Denominationalism

"I ask that men make no reference to my name, and call themselves not Lutherans, but Christians. What is Luther?, my doctrine, I am sure, is not mine, nor have I been crucified for any one. St. Paul, in I Corinthians 1, would not allow Christians to call themselves Pauline or Petrene, but Christian. How then should I, poor, foul carcass that I am, come to have men give to the children of Christ a name derived from my worthless name? No, no, my dear friends: let us abolish all party names, and call ourselves Christians..." —Martin Luther (A Compendia of Luther's Theology, pg. 135, The Westminster Press, 1943).

"Would to God that all party names, and unscriptural phrases and forms which have divided the Christian world, were forgot...that the very name (Methodist) might never be mentioned more, but be buried in eternal oblivion." —John Wesley (Universal Knowledge, Vol. 9, pg. 540),

"I look forward with pleasure to the day when there will not be a Baptist living! I hope that the Baptist name will soon perish, but let Christ's name last forever." —Charles Spurgeon (Spurgeon Memorial Library, Vol. 1, pg. 168.)
