

A Few Words from Jason

We had a great Gospel meeting last week with brother Garland Robinson, and I appreciate all who came out to knock doors. Brother Robinson helped us by sending out over 4,300 pieces of mail to everybody in Holt and Baker to teach them some fundamental truths from God's Word and invite them to the meeting. We had good attendance from area congregations, and at least one member of the community attended who was contacted through door knocking.

During the meeting, brother Robinson mentioned how it sometimes seems like Christians do not give enough glory to God. I agree, and I never want it to be said that we did not do enough to give God the glory He deserves. Any work done by us should not be to our glory, but to His. "So likewise ye, when ye shall have done all those things which are commanded you, say, We are unprofitable servants: we have done that which was our duty to do" (Luke 17:10). "...no flesh should glory in his presence. But of him are ye in Christ Jesus, who of God is made unto us wisdom, and righteousness, and sanctification, and redemption: That, according as it is written, He that glorieth, let him glory in the Lord" (1 Cor. 1:29-31). "For ye are bought with a price: therefore glorify God in your body, and in your spirit, which are God's" (1 Cor. 6:20). "Whether therefore ye eat, or drink, or whatsoever ye do, do all to the glory of God" (1 Cor. 10:31). "But he that glorieth, let him glory in the Lord. For not he that commendeth himself is approved, but whom the Lord commendeth" (2 Cor. 10:17-18).
