

## An "Oh Well" Attitude Toward **Disobedience to God**

The words "Oh well" indicate a dismissive attitude.

The words "Oh well" indicate something really doesn't matter.

The words "Oh well" say: "This is just how it is going to be."

The words "Oh well" mean one does not have a counter.

The words "Oh well" suggest one resigns to being wrong.

The words "Oh well" tell us the person doesn't really care.

Your boss tells you to complete a proposal by 5:00 p.m. When he comes to get it, you do not have it ready. He tells you this was necessary. Can you imagine responding: "Oh well"?

A child's parent tells him to clean his room sometime today. The parent gets home from work and the room is still a mess. When questioned, the child responds: "Oh well."

You go to a restaurant and are charged \$30.00 too much. You tell the waitress, and she responds: "Oh well."

All of these examples would cause the boss, the parent, and

ourselves to get very upset. "Oh well" would just ignite the fuse. What do you mean "oh well"? Oh well just does not get it.

The same is true when it comes to our disobedience to God. It is concerning how so many who are disobedient to God live with an "oh well" attitude. I don't study my Bible. "Oh well." I don't do evangelism. "Oh well." I don't attend worship services. "Oh well." I don't watch my words. "Oh well." I don't live a life of purity. "Oh well." The list is endless. The words "oh well" tell us they really aren't very concerned about disobeying God.

Oh well, this will have to do.

Oh well, you will just have to get over it.

Oh well, it is too late now.

Oh well.

Ugh! The words, "Oh well," just ring with arrogant defiance.

Some may let the words, "Oh well," stand. God will not.

"Therefore we ought to give the more earnest heed to the things which we have heard, lest at any time we should let them slip. For if the word spoken by angels was steadfast, and every transgression and disobedience received a just recompense of reward; how shall we escape, if we neglect so great salvation...?" (Heb. 2:1-3a).

Read the passage again. Pay a lot of attention to three phrases:

- 1. We ought to give the more earnest heed
- 2. Every transgression and disobedience received a just recompense of reward
- 3. How shall we escape, if we neglect so great salvation?

The Holy Spirit is teaching us that "Oh well" will not get it before God.
