



The Lord Our God is One: Thoughts on Deuteronomy 6:4 (3 of 3)

If one infers from Deuteronomy 6:4 that the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit are all the same divine Person, he has misinterpreted this verse. Is Jesus sitting on His own right hand? (Heb. 1:3, 13; 8:1; 12:2). If they are the same Being, how could Jesus be "with God"? (John 1:1). If Jesus and the Father are the same Being, why did Jesus say the Father taught Him? (John 8:28). Why did Jesus not know what the Father knew? (Mark 13:32). When Jesus was baptized, was He saying that He was pleased with Himself, or was a different Being speaking from Heaven? (Mat. 3:17, cf. 17:5). How can God be the Father and the God of Christ, with authority over Christ, if they are both the same Being? (John 20:17). Was Jesus constantly praying to Himself while on earth? (Mat. 26:39, Luke 6:12, John 17). If Jesus is the one Mediator "between" God and men, does that not distinguish Him from God the Father? (1 Tim. 2:5). John used the phrase "both the Father and the Son," so what does "both" mean? (2 John 9). After Jesus "came down from Heaven," why did He tell His followers to pray to their Father, who was in Heaven? (Mat. 6:9; Luke 11:1, 2; John 6:38). Why would Jesus say to ask Him nothing, but to ask the Father, if they are both the same? (John 16:23). Can the Father be called "Christ" (Anointed One), when the Father is the one who anointed Jesus, and nobody anointed the Father? (Acts 4:27, 10:38). Was God the Father "made a little lower than the angels for the suffering of death"?

(Heb. 2:9, cf. Luke 24:39, John 4:23-24). Why did Jesus say, "Father, into thy hands I commend my spirit," if they are both the same Spirit? (Luke 23:46, cf. Mat. 27:46, Eph. 4:4-6). More questions could be asked, and much more could be said about the Godhead Members, but a Scripturally balanced view of the Godhead with the One God and Father being "above all" is greatly needed.
