#### Allowing Culture to Be the Standard

In various places in Africa, when polygamy became popular, some missionaries began to accept it and justify it and tolerate it.

As immodesty has become a major part of our culture, many leaders in the church have turned a blind eye to it within their churches and get togethers.

As homosexuality has become more and more prevalent, denominations who once stood opposed have loosened their thinking and have decided to embrace it.

As women have started to take on more prominent roles within society, naturally it has moved over into the church, and now it is not uncommon to hear of women preachers or women elders. Church leaders who once stood opposed to it have embraced it and even sought to justify it by misusing Scripture (Gal. 3:28).

As divorce rates have sky-rocketed over the last 50 years within our country and have become so common that it effects more and more people, many churches have found clever ways around Jesus' one exception in Matthew 19:9 and are now teaching the very thing they used to oppose claiming to have found some new insights.

Churches who once stood firm on the authority of the Bible and sang and made melody in their hearts to the Lord through psalms, hymns and spiritual songs (Eph. 5:19; Col. 3:16) have found clever ways to justify using mechanical instruments in their worship, even though they have yet to find any New Testament authority for it.

Many churches once taught that baptism was a prerequisite for the forgiveness of sins (Acts 2:38; 22:16). Then they came out saying we have prayed and studied this topic for a long time and have since concluded something different. They re-imagined the word "for" in the Greek language in Acts 2:38 and found new insights whereby they can now just believe and be saved, although they would claim, it is still good to get baptized afterwards.

Folks, truth has never been popular and it never will be. We are living in a time when "they will not endure sound doctrine; but after their own lusts shall they heap to themselves teachers, having itching ears; And they shall turn away their ears from the truth, and shall be turned unto fables" (2 Tim. 4:3-4).

Regardless of how popular or unpopular the truth is, we need men now more than ever who will "preach the word; be instant in season, out of season; reprove, rebuke, exhort with all longsuffering and doctrine" (2 Tim. 4:2). Adapted, Steven Hill
