

# **He Humbled Himself**

Have you ever considered the humility of our Lord? The Lord Jesus Christ "...was rich, yet for your sakes he became poor, that ye through his poverty might be rich" (2 Corinthians 8:9). He gave up the treasures of Heaven for us! He lived in poverty and died a horrible death for us! Please notice the humility of our Lord:

The Lord humbled Himself to become a man – "Let this mind be in you, which was also in Christ Jesus: Who, being in the form of God, thought it not robbery to be equal with God:

But made himself of no reputation, and took upon him the form of a servant, and was made in the likeness of men" (Philippians 2:5-7).

He was submissive to his earthly parents – "And he went down with them, and came to Nazareth, and was subject unto them: but his mother kept all these sayings in her heart" (Luke 2:51).

He was submissive to His heavenly Father – "I can of mine own self do nothing: as I hear, I judge: and my judgment is just; because I seek not mine own will, but the will of the Father which hath sent me" (John 5:30). Jesus said, "...I do always those things that please him" (John 8:29).

His submissive humility was displayed in His baptism – "Then cometh Jesus from Galilee to Jordan unto John, to be baptized of him. But John forbad him, saying, I have need to be baptized of thee, and comest thou to me? And Jesus answering said unto him, Suffer it to be so now: for thus it becometh us to fulfill all righteousness. Then he suffered him" (Matthew 3:13-15).

The Son of God washed men's feet! – "After that he poureth water into a bason, and began to wash the disciples' feet, and to wipe them with the towel wherewith he was girded" (John 13:5).

He descended from the loftiest heights of Heaven and humbled Himself to the lowest possible point – the point of death on the cross! "And being found in fashion as a man, he humbled himself, and became obedient unto death, even the death of the cross" (Philippians 2:8).

There can be no doubt that the Lord Jesus Christ is the ultimate example of humility. After Christ's humble submission to death, He was exalted by God the Father: "Wherefore God also hath highly exalted him, and given him a name which is above every name: That at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, of things in heaven, and things in earth, and things under the earth; And that every tongue should confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father" (Philippians 2:9-11).

Christ taught us that we will also be exalted if we humble ourselves: "For whosoever exalteth himself shall be abased; and he that humbleth himself shall be exalted" (Luke 14:11). May we look to His example of humble obedience, and heed the words of Paul: "Let this mind be in you, which was also in Christ Jesus" (Philippians 2:5).
