

What We Are NOT Saying **About Baptism**

When one says that baptism is necessary for the forgiveness of sins, what is *not* being said is

- That water itself has special power to wash sin away.
- That works earn our righteousness before God.
- That Jesus' death and resurrection are not sufficient to save.
- That the blood of Christ is not necessary.

Of course, these are the many charges often leveled in such conversations, but they are simply untrue and do not actually deal with the issue.

What one IS saying is this

- Jesus' Gospel calls for us to die to ourselves and sin, and in obeying we yield ourselves to this (Romans 6).
- In baptism, God does all of the saving of man and washing his sin away, just the same as it was God who took down the walls of Jericho when Israel marched, and God who cleaned Naaman when he washed in Jordan.

- In baptism, faith is demonstrated as active, and living towards God (James 2:24).
- In baptism, we are saved by faith and made the children of God (Galatians 3:26-27).
- In baptism, we earn nothing, but wholly depend upon God for salvation.

Editor's Note: We are also not saying that "baptism alone" saves or that baptism guarantees salvation throughout the future. Nothing "alone" saves, as there are many things involved in our salvation, and baptism is the beginning of a new life that requires walking in the light as a faithful child of God to remain saved (2 Peter 1:3-11; 1 John 1:6—2:6, etc.). —JPH
